SUBJECT:

Application for continued grant funding from the California Emergency Management Agency for the Victim Witness Assistance Program.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Ratify the submission of the application for continued grant funding from the California Emergency Management Agency for the Victim/Witness Assistance Program in the amount of \$281,244 for Fiscal Year 2009/2010.
- 2. Ratify the Board Chairman's signature on the Face Sheet Agreement and all grant application documents necessary to secure grant funds.

SUMMARY:

California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA) issued a Request for Application for the Victim/Witness Assistance Program for the fiscal year 2009/2010. The purpose of the Victim/Witness Program is to provide mandated services to victims of violent crime in Tulare County.

The Victim/Witness Assistance Program provides decentralized services through existing community service centers in Visalia and Porterville, as well as by interacting with law enforcement agencies to facilitate services in rural areas.

The program receives referrals from all local law enforcement agencies, as well as our own Deputy District Attorney's, Child Protective Services, Adult Protective

Services, the Public Guardian's Office, funeral homes, hospitals, rape crisis centers, domestic violence shelters, and other service providers.

In order to increase program awareness throughout the County, staff networks with other agencies and service providers, and attends interagency meeting, health fairs, and related events. The program is promoted through radio, newspaper, and television PSAs.

The Victim/Witness Assistance Program includes providing victims with services such as crisis intervention, court support, case status and update, assistance in filing for benefits from the Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board, and orientation to the criminal justice system.

The program involves the dedication of 3.0 FTEs Victim Witness Workers/Advocates, 1.0 FTE Victim Witness Supervisor, 1.0 FTE Legal Office Assistant, and 0.35 FTE Project Coordinator.

Monies for this grant are provided through the State Victim Witness Act funds and Federal Victim of Crime Act funds. The grant period will be July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

This grant allocation is expected to be \$281,244, which will be included in the FY 2009/2010 budget for the Office of the District Attorney. There will be no net County cost.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year Strategic Business Plan and Management System include Safety and Security initiatives to provide for the safety and security of the public. Continued grant funding from CalEMA helps to fulfill this initiative. Through the Victim/Witness Assistance Program, dedicated staff provides services to victims of crime, including supportive services throughout the criminal justice proceedings, and by connecting them with financial assistance through the Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board.

VII. Special Condition for Grant Awards with Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Fund

The grant recipient agrees to administer the grant in accordance with the VOCA, the VOCA Program Guidelines, and the Office of Justice Programs Financial Guide.

All appropriate documentation must be maintained on file by the project and available for CalEMA or public scrutiny upon request. Failure to comply with these requirements may result in suspension of payments under the grant or termination of the grant or both and the Recipient may be ineligible for award of any future grants if the CalEMA determines that any of the following has occurred: (1) the Recipient has made false certification, or (2) violates the certification by failing to carry out the requirements as noted above.
