Agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture for Asian Citrus Psyllid detection funding

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Ratify and approve an agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA), providing state subvention to offset costs of Asian Citrus Psyllid (ACP) detection trapping retroactive to March 1, 2010 through September 30, 2010.
- 2. Find that the Board had authority to enter into the proposed agreement as of March 1, 2010, and that it was in the County's best interest to enter into the agreement on that date.
- 3. Authorize the Board Chairman to sign an agreement, retroactive to March 1, 2010 through September 30, 2010.
- 4. Authorize the Chairman to sign Form CCC-307 (Contractor Certification Clauses).
- 5. Approve the budget adjustments as shown on the attached aud308 form, requiring a 4/5th vote.

DATE: Asian Citrus Psyllid detection funding

SUMMARY:

This agreement is intended to render financial aid to the County for the costs associated with detection trapping for ACP. The early detection of this detrimental insect pest is critically important to the agricultural industry of our county. The effective date of the agreement is March 1, 2010 through September 30, 2010. County Counsel has approved similar agreements from CDFA as to form for pest detection trapping on April 28, 2009. The deviations from the County contract protocol included in the other agenda items were:

Form CCC-307 (Contractor Certification Clauses) is a package that contains clauses and conditions that may apply to this agreement and to persons doing business with the State of California.

Although the terms of this agreement (as do all State agreements) seem to suggest that the services performed before the contract is formally signed may not be compensable, the Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer is satisfied that this issue will not be (and has never been) problematic.

Traditionally CDFA contracts include provisions which deviate from county protocol, such as the following:

- 1) Exhibit C (GTC 307):
- a. (5) Indemnification: Contractor indemnifies State only.
- 2) Exhibit D Special Terms and Conditions:
- a. (2) Settlement of Disputes: If there is a dispute, the decision of the Agency Secretary or Designee shall be final.
- b. (4) Potential Subcontractors: County will be responsible to the State for acts/omissions of County's subcontractors.
- c. (5) Right to Terminate: State may terminate without cause with 30 days written notice, or immediately with cause. County can terminate with cause with 60 days written notice if the County cannot perform or the State fails to perform. The State will be relieved of further payment if the agreement is canceled. The proposed amendments to the contract do not include any additional deviations from the County contract protocol.

The only changes from similar contracts are changing the pest, term of the agreement, March 1, 2010 through September 30, 2010, and the dollar amount provided to the County, \$169,402.00.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The County will receive a maximum of \$96,943.00 for FY 2009/2010 and the balance of \$72,459.00 for FY 2010/2011 if this agreement is approved. Associated expenditures for these inspections will be added to the adopted FY 2009/2010 and included in the Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer's FY 2010/2011 requested budget. There is no net county cost to this program.

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LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the <u>Economic Well-Being Initiative</u> to promote economic development opportunities, effective growth management and a quality standard of living. This request to authorize an agreement with CDFA will provide a new funding source for a program of <u>protecting the County's agriculture-based economy</u> by insuring prompt detection and delimitation of an exotic insect pest that would threaten our citrus industry and our ability to export citrus products from our county.

ALTERNATIVES:

No action or disapproval would mean that the Agricultural Commissioner would not be able to receive financial aid from the CDFA to offset costs incurred in carrying out this program.

INVOLVEMENT OF OTHER DEPARTMENTS OR AGENCIES:

County Counsel has previously approved similar detection agreements as to form.
