SUBJECT:

Sequoia Valley Enterprise Zone

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Adopt the attached Resolution approving the Targeted Employment Area for the Sequoia Valley Enterprise Zone.
- 2. Authorize the County Administrative Officer to sign the attached Amendment #1–Joint Powers Agreement for Administration of California Enterprise Zone to:
 - A. Extend the original JPA for 15 years;
 - B. Change all references to the Private Industry Council to Workforce Investment Board;
 - C. Pay an annual share of the operation costs (\$79,200) as outlined in Exhibit B of the JPA Amendment, for the 15 year life of the Enterprise Zone; and
 - D. Assign management of the Job Creation Council and the Enterprise Zone to the EDC.
- Authorize the County Administrative Officer to sign the future Memorandum of Understanding and other documents necessary for the implementation of the Sequoia Valley Enterprise Zone, subject to County Counsel review and approval.

SUMMARY:

The Economic Development Corporation (EDC) has been providing coordination of

County. Through these coordinated efforts the EDC has applied for and received conditional designation for the Sequoia Valley Enterprise Zone. Within this Enterprise Zone there are designated Targeted Employment Areas (TEA). The identified TEA's are within specific census tracts and have specific boundaries.

In order to be eligible a census tract must have at least 51 percent of the households at or below low to moderate income levels. An employer will qualify to receive hiring tax credits when they hire residents who live within these TEA boundaries. The County is required by the State Department of Housing and Community Development to approve by resolution the boundaries of the TEA.

Additionally, in October 1998, the County entered into a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) with the EDC and the eight cities. The EDC has prepared an amendment to the JPA titled, Amendment # 1 – Joint Powers Agreement. By signing the Amendment the County is agreeing to the following:

- 1. Extend the original JPA for 15 years;
- 2. Change all references to the Private Industry Council to Workforce Investment Board:
- 3. Pay an annual share of the operation costs (\$79,200) as outlined in Exhibit B of the JPA Amendment, for the 15 year life of the Enterprise Zone; and
- 4. Assign management of the Job Creation Council and the Enterprise Zone to the EDC.

This resolution will also authorize the County Administrative Officer to sign the future Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and other documents necessary for the implementation of the Enterprise Zone. In the previous Resolution No. 2009-0139, authorizing the submittal of an application for Enterprise Zone designation, specific language authorizing the County Administrative Officer to sign the MOU and other documents necessary for the implementation of the Enterprise Zone was inadvertently left out. The MOU and any other necessary documents would be subject to County Counsel review and approval as to form.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The County's annual share of \$79,200 for the operation of the Enterprise Zone will be provided by the General Fund from the Miscellaneous Administration Budget.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

Economic Well Being – Support of the Tulare County Economic Development Corporation and the Sequoia Valley Enterprise Zone will provide job creation through the attraction, retention and expansion of eligible businesses taking advantage of the incentives available through the Enterprise Zone.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF TULARE ADOPTING THE TARGETED EMPLOYMENT AREAS FOR THE SEQUOIA VALLEY ENTERPRISE ZONE

WHEREAS, the cities of Dinuba, Exeter, Farmersville, Lindsay, Porterville, Tulare, Visalia, Woodlake, and the County of Tulare have each separately and jointly taken significant steps to coordinate their economic development efforts through the Economic Development Corporation (EDC) and to concentrate their respective resources in ways that would generate additional long-term employment in the private sector; and

WHEREAS, the cities of Dinuba, Exeter, Farmersville, Lindsay, Porterville, Tulare, Visalia, Woodlake, and the County of Tulare formed the Business Incentive Zone Council ("Council"), under a joint powers agreement, to work cooperatively in marketing and managing the Tulare County Targeted Tax Area over the past 12 years as a single labor market area without regard to jurisdictional boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the authority of the Council was expanded to include the application and implementation of the Enterprise Zone through the Economic Development Corporation, designated as the administrator of the Targeted tax Area and the Enterprise Zone; and

WHEREAS, on August 19, 2009, the Economic Development Corporation, acting on behalf of the cities of Dinuba, Exeter, Farmersville, Lindsay, Porterville, Tulare, Visalia, Woodlake, and the County of Tulare received conditional designation for the Sequoia Valley Enterprise Zone, with a 15 year zone designation period to begin upon receiving final Enterprise Zone designation from the State of California Department of Housing and Community Development; and

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 7073(a) requires any city, county, or city and county who applies for and receives designation as an enterprise zone, to also establish definitive boundaries for a targeted employment area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Tulare , as follows:

1. The following census tracts within the territorial jurisdictions of the County of Tulare and/or the cities of Dinuba, Exeter, Farmersville, Lindsay, Porterville, Tulare, Visalia, and Woodlake, as shown on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein, having been

determined to have at least 51 percent of its residents of low-or moderate-income levels, are hereby identified as those census tracts which are in the most need of employment targeting pursuant to Government Code Section 7072 (i): Census Tract Numbers are shown on exhibit A.





Amendment # 1 - Joint Powers Agreement Administration of California Enterprise Zone

WHEREAS, a Joint Powers Agreement was made and entered into on October 5, 1998 by and between THIS JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF ADMINISTRATION OF A TARGETED TAX AREA, made and entered into this

day of 2010, by and between the City of Dinuba, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Dinuba", the City of Exeter, hereinafter referred to as "Exeter", the City of Farmersville, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Farmersville", the City of Lindsay, hereinafter referred to as "Lindsay", the City of Porterville, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Porterville", the City of Tulare, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Tulare", the City of Visalia, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Visalia", the City of Woodlake, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Woodlake", and the County of Tulare, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as the "County". County, Dinuba, Exeter, Farmersville, Lindsay, Porterville, Tulare, Visalia and Woodlake, are hereinafter collectively referred to as the "parties".

WHEREAS, the parties have administered the Targeted Tax Area consistent with the provisions of the agreement and respective state regulations; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to have certain planned commercial and/or industrial areas designated as part of the California Enterprise Zone program; and

WHEREAS, a joint application of the parties for a designation for a California Enterprise Zone program is being prepared; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to maintain the current administration of the Targeted Tax Area for the California Enterprise Zone should such a zone be designated for the period of such designation.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of their mutual promises as hereinafter set forth, the parties agree to the following amendment of the Joint Powers Agreement dated October 5, 1998 as follows:

- I Provided that an Enterprise Zone is designated, the term of the Agreement shall be extended an additional 15 years from the date the Enterprise Zone designation is final by the State of California.
- 2. All references to the Private Industry Council shall be Workforce Investment Board, the successor organization to the Private Industry Council.
- 3. The costs incurred to operate the Enterprise Zone will be paid by the parties as outlined in Exhibit B.
- 4. The management of the Council and the Enterprise Zone shall be assigned to the Economic Development Corporation, which is the administrator of the current Targeted Tax Area.

Exhibit B Costs to Administer the Enterprise Zone

The current cost sharing for the EDC and BIZ will be combined to form the allocation for the new Enterprise Zone designation.
