HONORING ALTA VISTA SCHOOL ON ITS 100TH ANNIVERSARY

WHEREAS, Alta Vista School, founded in 1910 and originally located in the Reservation School District, puts forth its personal best to foster community-wide literacy, academic success, character development, community involvement and life-long learning; and

WHEREAS, the first site of Alta Vista School was located on the Tule River Indian Reservation, but was later moved in January 1954 to East Crabtree Avenue in east Porterville; and





WHEREAS, while located on the Tule River Indian Reservation, two Indian tribes, the Koyeti and Yaudanchi, attended Alta Vista School; and

WHEREAS, the Tulare County Board of Supervisors and Superintendent of Schools C.J. Walker approved the plan for the school and John J. Doyle donated the land; and

WHEREAS, Alta Vista School currently serves more than 500 kindergarten through eighth-grade students.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tulare County Board of Supervisors do hereby honor Alta Vista School on its 100th anniversary and its continuing efforts to provide all students with the opportunity to learn in a safe environment while becoming productive life-long learners and well-rounded citizens.
