SUBJECT:

Optional Excess Liability (OEL) Program

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- Ratify and approve the purchase of Optional Excess Liability Insurance with CSAC-EIA effective July 1, 2010; and
- 2. Find that the Board had authority to purchase the Optional Excess Liability Insurance as of July 1, 2010 and that it was in the County's best interest to purchase the insurance effect that date.

SUMMARY:

On June 30, 2010, your Board approved renewal of the General Liability I and II insurance programs. On June 29, 2010. The renewal of the General Liability I and II Insurance Programs provide the County with \$25 million in standard program limits.

Risk Management received the renewal details for the Optional Excess Liability Program on June 28, 2010 for the July 1, 2010 renewal date. Risk Management executed the participation agreement to bind coverage for the renewal on June 29, 2010. This purchase will replace expiring limits and provide the County with total liability limits of \$35 Million.

SUBJECT: Optional Excess Liability Program

DATE: July 27, 2010

For renewal the OEL coverage will be provided by means of a memorandum of coverage with CSAC-EIA rather than an excess insurance policy. The coverage is reinsured 100% through Torus Insurance (UK) Limited. The OEL Program will now be subject to assessment in the same manner as the General Liability I and II Program layers which are under a memorandum of coverage with CSAC-EIA.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The cost of the \$10 Million in Optional Excess Liability limits is \$36,580 and is four percent higher than the expiring coverage. The cost of expiring OEL limits was \$35,104 for the 2009/10 coverage year.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

Approval of this request will contribute to the organizational performance of the County through fiscal stability.

ALTERNATIVES:

No other reasonable alternatives exist.

INVOLVEMENT OF OTHER DEPARTMENTS OR AGENCIES:

Insurance costs are assessed among County agencies based on the agency's loss experience and exposure which is measured by Full Time Equivalents. An Agency's insurance allocation includes an amount for premium, administrative costs and funding of the self insured retention.
