Reaffirmation of Proclamation Declaring a State of Emergency in the Tulare County Drought Resolution No. 2008-0472.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Reaffirm Resolution No. 2008-0472, adopted June 24, 2008.

SUMMARY:

This agenda is to reaffirm Resolution No. 2008-0472, adopted June 24, 2008, declaring the County of Tulare to be in a state of emergency due to the current year drought and the accumulated impact of several drought years. Tulare County is experiencing severe property and economic loss as a result of the drought. Reaffirmation of this Proclamation will allow Tulare County to take all necessary actions to obtain State and Federal assistance and minimize regulatory burden to provide relief in the event accumulated economic losses are recoverable. The Board's approval of this reaffirmation of Resolution No. 2008-0472, will enable Tulare County to have a current formal Board Resolution in place to file claims with the appropriate State and Federal Agencies should assistance become available.

The 2008 Drought has created conditions of property and economic loss within Tulare County, evidenced by production loss of agricultural crops.
