SUBJECT:

Acceptance of continued grant funding from the California Emergency Management Agency for the Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach Program.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- Ratify and approve the Grant Award Agreement for the acceptance of grant funding from the California Emergency Management Agency for the Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach Program in the amount of \$125,000, with a \$31,250 match, for the period of October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011. This grant is retroactive due to having received the signed Agreement from the State in December 2010.
- 2. Ratify the Chairman of the Board's signature on the Agreement/Grant Award Face Sheet and all other grant application documents necessary to secure grant funds, retroactive to October 1, 2010.
- 3. Find that the Board had the authority to enter into the proposed Agreement as of October 1, 2010, and that it was in the County's best interest to enter into the Agreement on that date.
- 4. Approve the necessary budget adjustments per the attached AUD 308 (4/5th vote required).

SUBJECT: Acceptance of continued grant funding from the California Emergency

Management Agency for the Underserviced Victim Advocacy and Outreach

SUMMARY:

The California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA) issued a Request for Proposals for the Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach Program for the fiscal year 2010/2011. The purpose of the Program is to conduct outreach activities and provide mandated services to underserved victims of violent crime in Tulare County.

This Program will allow for the increased coordination of direct services, as well as the implementation of an enhanced outreach and awareness program, for the Spanish-speaking and elderly populations, which are determined to be underserved, throughout Tulare County. It will also include educational presentations for the public and other victim services providers.

Census estimates for 2009 show that 58% of the County population is Hispanic, and 44% speaks a language other than English. Therefore, it is essential that Victim Witness Workers (Advocates) serving this population be bilingual in English and Spanish.

The National Center on Elder Abuse estimates that elder abuse has increased by 15-20% since 2000. This age group is particularly vulnerable to various types of crime, including elder abuse and fraud. Elder abuse cases are complex, as abusers and their victims are often dependent on one another for financial assistance, housing, and other support.

The Program will provide victims with mandated services such as crisis intervention, court support, case status and update, assistance in filing for benefits from the Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board, and orientation to the criminal justice system.

The District Attorney's Office Victim Witness Center receives referrals from all local law enforcement agencies, as well as our own Deputy District Attorney's, Child Protective Services, Adult Protective Services, the Public Guardian's Office, funeral homes, hospitals, rape crisis centers, domestic violence shelters, local health care agencies, and other service providers.

In order to increase program awareness, as well as knowledge about victims' rights and services available, staff will network with other agencies and service providers, and attend interagency meeting, health fairs, and related events. Outreaching to our rural populations is crucial, as they often experience barriers to accessing victims' services.

Monies for this grant are provided through the State Victim Witness Act funds and Federal Victim of Crime Act (VOCA) funds. The Program will include the dedication of three (3.0 FTEs) Victim Witness Workers (Advocates), two (2.0 FTEs) of which will be bilingual in English and Spanish.

SUBJECT: Acceptance of continued grant funding from the California Emergency

Management Agency for the Underserviced Victim Advocacy and Outreach

Program.

DATE: January 25, 2011

The grant period will be October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011. This grant is retroactive to October 1, 2010 due to having received the signed Agreement from the State in December 2010.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The total program budget is \$156,250, of which \$125,000 is grant funds and \$31,250 is match has been included in the District Attorneys fiscal year 2010/2011 budget and will be moved to a new organizational unit. No additional net County cost is required.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year Strategic Business Plan and Management System include Safety and Security initiatives to provide for the safety and security of the public. Continued grant funding from CalEMA helps to fulfill this initiative. Through the Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach Program, dedicated staff will provide services to victims of crime, including supportive services throughout the criminal justice proceedings, and by connecting them with financial assistance through the Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board.

III. Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 – (Recipient Handbook, Section 2152)
