#### SUBJECT:

Application for continued funding from the Juvenile Accountability Block Grants (JABG) Program 2011/2012.

## REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Ratify and approve the submission of an application for continued grant funding, available through the Juvenile Accountability Block Grants (JABG) Program and administered by the Corrections Standards Authority (CSA), in the amount of \$43,712, with a \$4,371 match, for the period of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012;
- 2. Ratify and approve the Board Chairman's signature on the Agreement and all grant application documents necessary to secure grant funds;
- 3. Find that the Board had authority to submit the application for grant funds on May 27, 2011 and that it was in the County's best interest to submit the application on that date;
- Agree to provide all matching funds required for said project, and abide by the statutes and regulations governing the JABG Program, as well as the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the CSA;
- 5. Find that the grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.

## **SUMMARY**:

Since 1998, the Juvenile Accountability Block Grants (JABG) Program has been made possible though a yearly federal appropriation. The State of California grants these funds to units of local government based on a formula calculation.

The Probation Department will utilize JABG 2011/2012 funds to offset the costs of one full-time Probation Officer to focus on juvenile gangs and juvenile crime. The Probation Officer assigned will continue to provide community-based probation supervision services to maximum-risk juvenile probationers during the grant period by enhancing the scope of influence in the accountability of juvenile offenders.

Applicants must submit a resolution from their governing board addressing specific requirements. The resolution must be on file with the Corrections Standards Authority (CSA) prior to a finalized grant award agreement. The Probation Department will return to the Board for project acceptance when the application is approved by the CSA.

### **FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:**

Total project cost for Fiscal Year 2011/2012 is \$48,083. The grant allocation is \$43,712. The required cash match of \$4,371 will be made by the Probation Department, and will be included in the FY 2011/2012 requested budget. The salary and benefit cost for one FTE Probation Officer III is \$61,795. The remaining costs associated with the position are offset by SB 789 Realignment funds and Title IV-E revenue.

## LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic business plan includes the Safety and Security initiative that provides for the safety and security of the public. The approval of this application helps fulfill this initiative by providing funds to offset the costs of one Probation Officer III to continue to provide community-based probation supervision services to maximum-risk juvenile probationers and enhance the scope of influence in the accountability of juvenile offenders.
