REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

June 21, 2011

- 1. Introduce and waive the first reading of an Ordinance adding Chapter 27 to Part 1 Government and Administration of the Ordinance Code of Tulare County, Pertaining to County Public Facilities Impact Fees in the Incorporated and Unincorporated Areas of Tulare County.
- 2. Set a Public Hearing for July 12, 2011.
- 3. Approve the Summary of the Ordinance and direct the Clerk of the Board to publish the summary and post a certified copy of the complete ordinance five (5) days prior to the Ordinance adoption.

Facilities Impact Fees

DATE: June 21, 2011

SUMMARY:

On November 30, 2010, your Board conducted a public hearing and adopted Resolution No. 2010-0927 requiring future development to participate in the Tulare County Development Impact Fee Program. On March 22, 2011, the Board Agenda proposed adoption of Chapter 27 to Part 1 Government and Administration of the Ordinance Code of Tulare County, Pertaining to County Public Facilities Impact Fees in the Incorporated and Unincorporated Areas of Tulare County. The Board continued the item to June 21, 2011. At the March hearing representatives from Visalia, Home Builders Association (HBA), and others spoke on the matter and requested that the item not be adopted. HBA submitted a letter dated, March 22, 2011, and identified concerns relating to the ordinance as presented to the Board. Staff provided a response to the HBA letter and has made some modifications to the proposed ordinance.

Fee Studies Outreach:

April 27 and April 29, 2011: RMA staff has conducted four workshops to date; April 27, 2011 on the Public Facilities Fee and April 29, 2011 on the Traffic Impact Fee Studies. These two workshops focused on the City representatives and the Visalia Chamber of Commerce. It was suggested by those in attendance that the development community – primary contactors and builders from each city should be contacted and give the opportunity to participate in the Development Impact Fee program being proposed by the County. RMA staff contacted each city as well as HBA and received their listing of contractors and builders.

June 10, 2011: The workshop conducted on June 10, 2011 presented the Traffic Impact Fee Study at 9:00 A.M and the Public Facilities Fee Study at 10:30 A.M. In addition, a schedule of the Development Impact Fee process was presented. Approximately 450 mailings of the notice was distributed on May 20, 2011 and on June 2, 2011 approximately 950 mailings occurred.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

Impact to the General Fund is estimated at \$3,000 for public hearing notices and distribution of related information material.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five year strategic plan includes the "Economic Well being Initiative - to promote economic development opportunities, effective growth management and a quality standard of living." The proposed Development Impact Fees will ensure that new development in Tulare County will pay its fair share of needed new services and facilities.

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ALTERNATIVES:

1. The Board could choose not to consider or adopt legislative authority to collect development impact fees.

2. The Board could choose to refer the matter back to staff for further discussion and analysis and return to the Board prior to taking action.
