SUBJECT:

Acceptance of the Tulare County Mental Health Services Act undistributed funds from fiscal year 2010/2011 and prior fiscal years per Assembly Bill 100.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Authorize the Tulare County Director of Mental Health to accept the State Department of Mental Health identified Tulare County undistributed Mental Health Services Act funds from fiscal year 2010/2011 and prior fiscal years in the amount of \$5,243,400, per Assembly Bill 100.
- 2. Approve the necessary budget adjustments per the attached AUD 308 (4/5ths vote required).

SUMMARY:

California voters approved Proposition 63, the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) in November 2004. MHSA provides the opportunity for the State Department of Mental Health to provide increased funding, personnel, and other resources to support county mental health programs and monitor progress toward statewide goals for children and youth, adults, older adults, and families. MHSA addresses a broad continuum of prevention, early intervention, and service needs and the necessary infrastructure, technology, and training elements that will effectively support the system.

The recent enactment of Assembly Bill 100 significantly changed the responsibilities of the Department of Mental Health (DMH) in the administration of the MHSA. In keeping with the Governor's intent to place funding and decision making authority at the level closest to the people who benefit from services, DMH has identified all undistributed MHSA funds from the current and prior fiscal years. DMH has instructed the State Controller's Office to release those funds to counties in June 2011. The counties cannot expend the funds from their trust until they have a locally approved component plan for each of the funds being distributed. Component plans outline how the community planning efforts dictate the spending of the funds within the spending parameters described in guidelines released by DMH. Component plans are being developed and written at this time, and will be brought before the Board of Supervisors after Mental Health Board approval. Plans include the remaining Capital Facilities expenditures, Innovation component, and the Prevention and Early Intervention Training and Technical Assistance funds.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

Through the Board's approval of the attached AUD 308, we are requesting an increase in the current Fiscal Year 2011/2012 County budget, funded by the State's undistributed MHSA funds from fiscal year 2010/2011 and prior fiscal years in the amount of \$5,243,400. No Net County Cost.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year plan includes the Quality of Life initiative to promote and encourage the provision of quality supportive services for individuals in Tulare County. The MHSA programs contribute to that initiative by providing mental health services to otherwise underserved and unserved individuals in Tulare County.

ALTERNATIVES:

The Board could choose to take no action; however, selection of this alternative is not recommended. Tulare County residents, mental health consumers, and family members of mental health consumers will benefit from the provision of mental health services funded by the Mental Health Services Act.

Dear Ms. Ryan:

Thank you for the partnership and thoughtful guidance you and the CMHDA have provided to the Department of Mental Health (DMH) during the implementation of the Governor's proposals for redirection of MHSA dollars to support community mental health services.

It is my priority to keep this partnership active and healthy to productively address the many transition issues we will confront as the State budget is negotiated and new laws are implemented.

The recent enactment of Assembly Bill 100 significantly changed the responsibilities of the DMH in the administration of the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA). In keeping with the Governor's intent to place decision making authority at the level closest to the people who benefit from the services, AB 100 presents many opportunities to streamline and improve polices and procedures to allow counties to more effectively implement MHSA funded programs.

Supporting the intent of AB 100 to create a reliable flow of funds to counties, DMH has identified all undistributed MHSA funds from the current and prior fiscal years, and will instruct the State Controller's Office to release those funds to counties in June 2011. In addition, each County Mental Health Director will receive a letter from DMH providing the details of their county's release of funds. Details will include each component from which funds were released, the dollar amount distributed from these component allocations and the fiscal year in which the funds were initially made available. Finally, the letter will also include a DMH contact for any questions the county might have.

I look forward to our continued partnership as we address the structural, administrative, and policy changes developed to improve delivery of community mental health services to the people of California.
