SUBJECT:

Selection of a cost-of-living factor to be used in the 2011-12 GANN appropriations limit calculation

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Select the change in California per capita personal income which is 2.51% as the cost-of-living factor for the Gann Appropriations Limit calculation for the fiscal year 2011-12.

SUMMARY:

In November 1979, California voters passed Proposition 4 and in June 1990, Proposition 111 amended the requirements which added Article XIIIB to the State Constitution. This article established limits on proceeds of taxes on State and local (county and city) spending each fiscal year. Under Section 8 (e) of this article, the Board of Supervisors is required to select which cost-of-living factor is to be used in the County's appropriations limit. The two options are:

- A. The change in California per capita personal income, which is 2.51% for 2011-12; or,
- B. The percentage change in the jurisdiction's assessed valuation attributable to non-residential new construction which is -19.48% for 2010-11.

DATE: December 13, 2011

Since the higher cost-of-living factor would produce a more advantageous appropriations limit (2.51% vs -19.48%), the recommendation is to select the change in California per capita personal income which is 2.51 % as the cost-of-living factor for the Gann Appropriations Limit calculation for the fiscal year 2011-12.

Upon selection of the cost-of-living factor, we will proceed with the necessary calculations to establish the dollar amount for the 2011-12 Appropriations Limit and thereafter submit for approval from your Board, the 2011-12 Appropriations Limit.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

There will be no fiscal impact to the 2011-12 budget.
