SUBJECT:

Approval of an amendment to Agreement No. 24418 with Tulare Joint Union High School District for Immunizations or Public Health Services.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve an amendment to Agreement No. 24418 with Tulare Joint Union High School District to receive immunizations or public health services from Tulare County Health & Human Services Agency retroactive to July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2015. This amendment is retroactive due to inadvertent delays in obtaining authorized signatures. It was impracticable for the Board to take action prior to July 1, 2012 due to the time needed to process, prepare, and submit the agenda item.
- 2. Find that the Board had authority to enter into the proposed amendment as of July 1, 2012 and that it was in the County's best interest to enter into the amendment on that date; and
- 3. Authorize the Chairman of the Board to sign three (3) copies of the amendment.

SUMMARY:

Tulare County Health & Human Services Agency (HHSA) is requesting approval of an amendment to agreement no. 24418 with Tulare Joint Union High School District to provide space at their school which will enable HHSA, Department of Health to provide immunizations or public health services. School nurses will assist HHSA,

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Department of Health staff in planning and conducting immunizations or public health service clinics. HHSA, Department of Health will provide training, orientation, technical assistance, evaluation, and professional supervision of nursing and health professional staff. The number of potential immunizations or public health services needed will be determined by parental surveys, created through the schools own system. In 2011, approximately 300 Tulare County residents received services through this agreement.

We would like to bring the following item to the Board's attention that deviates from County Contract Protocol: The term of this amendment is for multiple years.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

There is no cost associated with this amendment. Immunization and Public Health Services are a part of the Health Services budget and are included in the proposed Fiscal Year 2012/2013, 2013/2014, and 2014/2015 budgets.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year strategic plan includes the Quality of Life Initiative to promote health and well being for the citizens of Tulare County. This amendment will help to fulfill this initiative by providing essential immunization and Public Health Services as needed to the residents of Tulare County.
