SUBJECT:

Ordinance Amending Certain Sections of the Tulare County Ordinance Code Pertaining to Speed Limits

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Introduce and waive the first reading of an Ordinance amending Section 3-01-1175, "Tulare Area" and Section 3-01-1180, "Visalia Area" to Part III, Chapter 1, Article 3 of the County Ordinance Code pertaining to speed limits; and
- Set the second reading for March 19, 2013.
- 3. Waive the second reading and adopt an Ordinance amending Section 3-01-1175, "Tulare Area" and Section 3-01-1180, "Visalia Area" to Part III, Chapter 1, Article 3 of the County Ordinance Code pertaining to speed limits; and
- 4. Direct the Clerk of the Board to publish the ordinance after adoption as required by law.

SUMMARY:

Road 108 between the Cities of Tulare and Visalia limits is approximately 3.5 miles long. It is signalized at the intersections of Avenue 272 and Avenue 264 and is primarily an undeveloped rural arterial roadway with two lanes in each direction and a dirt median. The roadway, in the unincorporated portion of the County, is not currently posted with speed limit signs and has a prima facie maximum speed of 65 miles per hour which is defined as a speed limit above which drivers are presumed to be driving unlawfully.

SUBJECT: Ordinance Amending Certain Sections of the Tulare County Ordinance

Code Pertaining to Speed Limits

DATE: March 5, 2013

According to the California Vehicle Code, the establishment of a speed limit zone by local ordinance requires an engineering and traffic survey. The primary factor when setting speed limits is to establish the limit preferably at or near the prevailing speed of the traffic. The prevailing (critical) speed is defined as the 85th-percentile speed which is the speed at or below which 85% of the vehicular traffic travels. Road 108 at this location was evaluated under this criterion. Although the establishment of speed limits must be primarily based on the prevailing speed, other factors to be considered include the accident record, roadside improvements, traffic characteristics etc.

Staff recently performed a speed survey on Road 108 which revealed that the prevailing speed of traffic north of Avenue 264 is 63 miles per hour. In addition, the posted speed limit on Demaree Street, at the Visalia City limits is 40 miles per hour and the posted limit at the City limits of Tulare is 40 miles per hour.

The Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) states that speed zones should be developed in 10 miles per hour increments except in urban areas where 5 miles per hour increments are preferable. Therefore, to be in compliance with MUTCD staff recommends the Board approve a reduction of the prima facie speed limit of 65 miles per hour on Road 108 to a posted speed limit of 50 miles per hour from the Visalia City Limits to 1,300 feet north of Avenue 272; from 1,300 feet north of Avenue 272 to 1,300 feet south of E. Pacific Avenue to 60 miles per hour; and from 1,300 feet south of E. Pacific Avenue to the Tulare City Limits to 50 miles per hour.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The cost to install speed limit signs on the subject segment of Road 108 is estimated to be approximately \$4,000 which is budgeted in the current fiscal year's Roads Budget for signs. There will be no net cost to the County's General Fund at this time.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

Strategic Initiative: Safety and Security includes the goal of improving and maintaining an adequate transportation infrastructure. The reduction of the prima facie speed limit of 65 miles per hour to the recommended posted speed limits, as stated above, will improve the overall traffic safety for all types of vehicles traveling on Road 108.


