SUBJECT:

Approve an Agreement with Kings View Corporation for the Warm

Line Program.

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- Approve an Agreement with Kings View Corporation in an amount not to exceed \$199,755, to provide the Warm Line Program retroactive from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015. This agreement is retroactive due to inadvertent delays in obtaining authorized signatures. It was impracticable for the Board to take action prior to July 1, 2014 due to the time needed to process, prepare, and submit the agenda item;
- 2. Find that the Board had authority to enter into the proposed agreement as of July 1, 2014 and that it was in the County's best interest to enter into the agreement on that date; and
- 3. Authorize the Chairman of the Board to sign three (3) copies of the agreement.

SUMMARY:

The Tulare County Health & Human Services Agency (HHSA), Department of Mental Health, collaborates with the Kings View Corporation to provide mental health services under the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) Warm Line Program.

The Warm Line Program is designed to reduce disparities in accessing services for

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emotional and mental health needs by providing readily available, linguistically appropriate phone support. Staffed largely by former consumers of mental health services trained to appropriately handle community calls, the Warm Line provides support, information, and referral to individuals experiencing emotional and/or mental health issues, and their family members, at no cost to the caller. Additionally, the Warm Line acts as pre-emptive support for many consumers, assisting them in continuing to manage their own care and avoid higher and more costly levels of care.

From July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015, the program plans to provide services to an anticipated 1,200 callers.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

The funds for this agreement are included in Fiscal Year 2014/2015proposed budget, at a maximum of \$199,755 and are paid through Mental Health Services Act (MHSA), Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) funding. No Net County Cost.

LINKAGE TO THE COUNTY OF TULARE STRATEGIC BUSINESS PLAN:

The County's five-year plan includes the Quality of Life initiative to promote and encourage the provision of quality supportive services for individuals in Tulare County. The MHSA PEI programs contribute to that initiative by providing mental health services to otherwise un/underserved individuals in Tulare County.
